One of these men was also charged with a breach of an anti-social behaviour order (ASBO). Both men were arrested and dealt with soon after the assault.

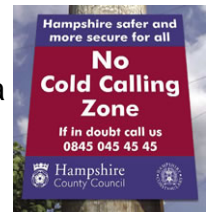
Thefts from motor vehicles

Please be vigilant. Do not leave any valuables in your vehicles and do not leave any items which could attract thieves on display, such as:

- Hand bags and wallets
- Mobile Phones
- Any luggage / bags (even if empty)
- Stereos, MP3 Players or CDs
- Loose change – It is not uncommon to receive reports where a car window is smashed and sums stolen can be as little as £2.
- Sat Navs' / cradles - if you leave the cradle attached thieves may still break in to look for the Sat Nav.
- Cigarettes
