Our local pledge and priorities

We are committed to working with you and our partners to identify local concerns which help us to determine the priorities for your neighbourhood.

1. To cut crime in your area, making it a safer place to live and work.
2. To reduce anti social behaviour by dealing with offenders robustly and by carrying out high visibility patrols of those areas most affected.
3. To meet and work with as many residents as possible, and to promote responsible citizenship among our young people by engaging with them at schools and in the local youth clubs.

ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

Reports of anti-social behaviour in the Testwood area have fallen dramatically over the last two months. After a series of incidents in one area, the group of children responsible was identified and dealt with and the problems have stopped. Also, after reports of anti-social and dangerous driving, we have issued the driver with a Section 59 warning. This means that if he behaves in the same way

again we will seize his car. High visibility and covert patrols in the areas most affected by anti social behaviour are having a real affect so please if anti-social behaviour is affecting you and your quality of life, or if you witness any incidents taking place, please us know by calling our 101 number.

BURGLARY

Only one person had their house burgled during the last two

months, while an arrest has been made in connection with a burglary at the Co-op on Salisbury Road.

THEFT FROM MOTIOR VEHICLES.

All four vehicles broken into over the last two months were left UNLOCKED. Please make sure you lock your vehicle at all times, even if it is parked on your driveway.

CRIMINAL DAMAGE

Cars were once again the main victims of the criminal damages that were reported to us. Four people have been arrested and charged with the offence and several school children have been told to write letters of apology.

OTHER NEWS

An operation carried out by the Totton team led to the discovery of two cannabis farms, believed to be valued at approximately £100,000.

Almost 100 fully grown plants were discovered and those responsible have been arrested and are due in court in the New Year.
