Amateur Film Competition

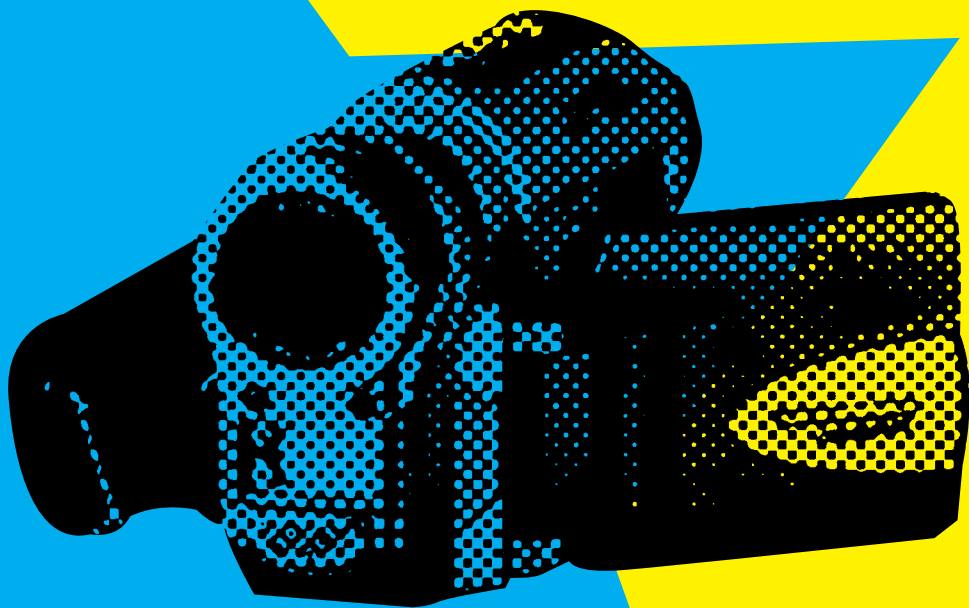
Can you create an original film highlighting the dangers of underage drinking and anti-social behaviour?

The technical bit for film-makers to sign up to

'The organisers' refers to Thames Valley Police, Hampshire Constabulary and NHS South Central. People featured within submitted films must provide written consent for their image to be used by Thames Valley Police, Hampshire Constabulary and NHS South Central for whatever the partners think is appropriate.

Only dramatisations of events will be accepted. The organisers forbid any illegal activities from taking place during the creation of the videos and DO NOT encourage any underage drinking or anti-social behaviour may not take place during this competition.

Filmmakers cannot use any existing copyright material including material from feature films or off-air television programmes.

Production music can be used by going through the MCPS-PRS Alliance <http://www.mcps-prs-alliance.co.uk/Pages/default.aspx>. Their permission must be submitted with the film. Filmmakers must get permission from copyright holders to use published music or use their own compositions.

Filmmakers should be aware that submitted films may be used by Thames Valley Police, Hampshire Constabulary and NHS South Central for the purposes of the Regional Alcohol Campaign in a variety of formats which could include publishing the films on the partners websites and in the media, both television and online, and showcasing the films during the competition. The films may also be produced in DVD format for educational purposes.

The decisions of the public judge will be final. No correspondence or discussion concerning any decision shall be entered into.

No entries will be returned. Each entrant is advised to retain a copy where appropriate.

Entrants agree that:

- (i) The entry submitted is their original work.
- (ii) The entry will not infringe the copyright or any other rights of any third parties.
- (iii) There is no agreement with any other person which shall in any way interfere with any rights granted to the organisers hereafter
- (iv) Entries must not be defamatory, obscene, profane or pornographic nor contain materials which disclose private or personal matters or personal data concerning any person without such person's written consent nor contain any message, data or images that would violate the intellectual property rights of others including unauthorised copyright text, music, images or programming, trade secrets or other confidential proprietary information or trademarks used in an infringing fashion.

The description of the awards prizes and selection process in any competition literature or other medium is not binding and may be varied by the competition organisers.

Entrants must have been born between September 30th 1994 and August 31st 1996 and officially enrolled at a secondary school within Hampshire or the Thames Valley region. Only those born between September 30th 1994 and August 31st 1996 are eligible to work on the entry, any entries caught using the help of an external source who is not under the competition age will be disqualified.

All applicants must have the allocated consent form signed by a legal guardian which awards permission to enter the competition.

The organisers reserve the right to seek and issue publicity on behalf of entrants.
