Welcome to the latest Fawley Parish newsletter

This newsletter is brought to you by Hampshire Constabulary and the local beat officers for your parish area, which covers Fawley, Calshot, Blackfield, Holbury and Hardley. Your local officers are PC Adrian Woodhead, PC Yates and PCSO Olie Hulse, who are also assisted by Special Constable, Adam Hillier. Together they strive to reduce crime and anti-social behaviour, offer care and reassurance for victims of crime and aim to have an active presence in every neighbourhood.

Marine crime

At present, and since the last newsletter, Ashlett Creak has been subject to a number of boat and marine-related thefts. Items such as small outboard motors have been taken from locked and secure boats which have been taken out of the water for the winter. A wide range of equipment has been stolen, some valuable and some more sentimental.

Police officers and PCSOs have been conducting regular patrols of this area in order to detect and deter this type of crime. We have also been 'stop checking' anyone found in the area who we believe may not have a genuine reason to be there.

In response to these incidents, PC Woodhead and PCSO Hulse set up a Crime Prevention event on March 20. Boat owners and others were invited along to speak to the officers about crime prevention measures and they were also offered the opportunity to get their equipment engraved and security marked. This can help police to return items to you if they are stolen and then later recovered.

Crime prevention

Another crime prevention day will be held for local residents on May 8 between 10am and 4pm. This time it will be in the Calshot area. PC Woodhead and PCSO Hulse will be in a police vehicle and will start at the beach huts next to Solent Rescue before moving on to Calshot Activity Centre later in the day. The aim of the day will be to speak to members of the community who socialise in the area and who may be having their property damaged. We will be speaking to them about their concerns and offering them relevant crime prevention advice. We will also be able to security mark their equipment, to help them to protect it from thieves.

Beat surgeries

Beat Surgeries and Street Meets are designed to provide members of the community with the opportunity to come along and meet their local policing team in person and to tell them what is important to them in their neighbourhood. By coming along and having your say, you can play a part in setting local policing priorities.



We are holding a 'Street Meet' at Tesco Express on Hampton Lane in Blackfield on Thursday, May 12 between 12 noon and 1pm.

A drop in session is also being held at the Neighbourhood Centre on Heather Road in Fawley between 1.30pm and 3pm on Wednesday, May 18.

If you have any concerns or issues in your neighbourhood which you would like to discuss with your dedicated local team then please come along to one of these meetings.

As always, local officers are spending time targeting local criminals and are always looking for quality information from members of the community which could help us to make arrests and execute warrants. Anyone who wants to speak to the police can do so anonymously via Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111 or in confidence to any police officer.
