## The Safer Neighbourhoods team priorities are:

- Reducing anti-social behaviour, particularly around Testwood Recreation ground.
- Conducting regular licensing visits to all licensed premises in Totton and surrounding areas.

## Welcome to the latest newsletter from your Safer Neighbourhoods team for Testwood.

The Pub Watch Scheme in Totton is now fully established and 19 people have been banned from all the pubs taking part. This should lead to a more pleasant experience in your 'local' and surrounding area and allow us to concentrate on matters affecting everyone, however there have been a couple of thefts from pubs, a coat and a handbag were stolen while left unattended.

The Safer Streets Team based at Lyndhurst has conducted test purchase operations (youth attempts to buy alcohol) in Totton and all but one premises passed.

We have been issued with a laser speed device which we will only deploy to areas where complaints about speeding have been received.

Street Meetings took place in January at McColls in Water Lane and St Winifred's Church with about 30 people spoken to at each venue and with one or two exceptions people attending had no issues to report to us.

## Burglary

There was one burglary which was domestic related and a person was arrested but later released with no further action. Four sheds, garages and other non-dwellings were broken into. Two people were arrested and later charged with burglary at a convenience store. Testwood School is dealing internally with another matter. A cycle and a motocross bike were also stolen from a shed and a garage.

## Criminal Damage

There were nine reports of damage, mainly to vehicles with one matter being settled between the aggrieved and suspect. One person has been charged with damaging a car and a youth has been identified as being responsible for smashing a house window.

## Theft

Seven thefts have been reported. One is a shoplifting offence, another a domestic related theft, two thefts at pubs, theft of a cycle and the theft of a vehicle, which was left unattended with the engine running.

## Rowdy and Inconsiderate Behaviour

Most of the rowdy reports took place after the snowfall and consisted of groups of youngsters throwing snowballs at cars and houses.
