- Reducing anti-social behaviour, particularly around Testwood Recreation ground.
- Conducting regular licensing visits to all licensed premises in Totton and surrounding areas.

Welcome to the latest newsletter from your Safer Neighbourhoods team for Testwood.

From now onwards our beat reports will be circulated every two months, so please expect your next issue in mid-February 2010.

The number of incidents reported to us since our last report has, once again, been slightly lower than the same period last year.

Burglary: 3

There was one dwelling burglary in this period. Two youths were arrested. One was charged and the other received a final warning.

There were also two non-dwelling burglaries which took place. One was a shed and the other was at a commercial premises. Two separate pairs of people have been arrested for these incidents.

Damage: 13

The majority of damage incidents involved stones being thrown at windows. Two youths are currently under investigation in relation to these incidents.

Thefts: 12

There were a series of thefts of charity collection boxes, not just in Testwood but at premises across Totton. A man and a woman were arrested and charged with theft and appeared at the New Forest Magistrates Court on December 3.

The other thefts relate to shoplifting offences. The suspects have been identified and evidence is currently being gathered.

Vehicle Related Crime: 2

Two vehicles were targeted recently. These incidents included windscreen wipers or other parts being taken, a window being smashed and a mobile phone stolen from inside.

There has been an increase in thefts from motor vehicles at New Forest car parks and so if

you go walking in the Forest, we urge you to either leave your valuables at home or carry them with you. Please do not leave any valuables in your car when it is unoccupied.
