Welcome to the latest newsletter from your Safer Neighbourhoods team for Romsey Town Centre.

ACTION UNDERTAKEN IN RELATION TO YOUR PRIORITIES

You said: Anti-social behaviour was a concern around Subway in Latimer Walk.

We did: We deal robustly with public order incidents and anti-social behaviour. We arrest people committing these offences and appropriate action is taken. We also issue notices to people to leave the area and not to return within a given time. We continue to work closely with staff at Subway resolve this.

CRIME PREVENTION

Cycle Thefts

Please make sure that your cycle is locked and secure before leaving it unattended. Please record your cycle details and postcode it so if stolen we are able to return it to you when found. Post coding stickers can be made available from the police station.

Thefts from vehicles

Please make sure that you don't leave anything on display when leaving your vehicle unattended, Sat navs and valuables may be stolen.

Purse thefts

Finally, make sure that you keep your handbag zipped up with your purse out of view to try and prevent it from being stolen. Keep your handbag with you at all times and avoid carrying large amounts of money.



We hold regular **Shop Watch** meetings with the town centre retailers to make them aware of purse thefts and other retail related crime.

ACTION UNDERTAKEN IN RELATION TO YOUR PRIORITIES

You said: Anti-social behaviour at the Memorial Park was an issue.

We did: We have increased patrols in the area however; this has not resolved the issue. We are holding a street surgery later this month for homes surrounding the park to try to get updates from residents to enable us to target our patrols more effectively. We are also liaising closely with the ground staff at the park to monitor the situation. Anyone found to be involved in anti-social behaviour in the park will be dealt with robustly.

ACTION UNDERTAKEN IN RELATION TO YOUR PRIORITIES

You said: People parking in 'prohibition of driving' areas is an ongoing issue.

We did: We ran a vehicle prohibition operation and visited approximately 10 roads which were listed as being covered by the restrictions. We found a small number of vehicles which could possibly have been parked there for reasons other than gaining access to a property or land. These vehicles were all unoccupied and so were issued with notices.
