Hi and welcome to the latest newsletter from your Safer Neighbourhoods team for Beaulieu, Denny, Exbury and Lepe.

This period has seen an increase in the number of incidents which coincides with the increase in the number of visitors to the New Forest.

There have been a few thefts of fuel from boats recently and we would advise fitting of a locking fuel cap and not to leave any containers of fuel on the boat.

I also recommend marking with an engraver any property left on a boat or by Smartwater or something similar. Please also note the serial numbers of any property and leave it in a safe place.

Theft

A number of thefts have occurred from premises, half of which have occurred overnight. We have had eleven suspicious reports made by residents and staff working in the area. This is very rewarding to see that residents are working with the police trying to prevent crime.

Fly tipping

There have still been a number of incidents of fly tipping within our area. The place where rubbish is left varies on each occasion so it is very difficult to catch the culprits. There have also been occasions recently where this has occurred in the middle of the day. One of these incidents involved six dead chickens which were removed by the council.
