What we have done to address community concerns:

You said: We have received reports from residents of an increase in anti-social behaviour in Firgrove Clove, Fleming Avenue and Borden Way.

We did: We have been carrying out regular patrols in these areas, both during the day and in the evenings, as have our colleagues from partner agencies.

Justice seen, justice done

A man was arrested for burglary (other than a dwelling) and for possession of counterfeit money. A local man has been arrested and charged with theft of beer from the COOP in Seymour Lane. Another local man was arrested and charged with theft of a vehicle, and a man from Southampton was arrested and charged with burglary. He has been remanded in custody until a court date in January.

Three warnings for possession of cannabis have been issued, and a man from Portsmouth was arrested on suspicion of receiving stolen goods in Fulford Road. A man has been to court and removed from a Testway Housing property due to his anti social behaviour, and two people from North Baddesley were arrested and charged for drink driving.

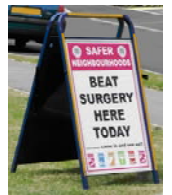
Crime prevention

You can take some very simple steps to help protect your property. Please make a note of the serial numbers on your valuables, especially any new things you may have received for Christmas, and register these on www.immobilise.com. You might also want to consider marking any valuable items such as video consoles or laptops with a UV pen, which you can get from the police station. These leave markings that are invisible but can be seen with a UV light, making property easier to trace if it is ever lost or stolen.

We have had a report of a bicycle being stolen recently, please remember to lock and secure your bike when visiting the town centre or at home. We recommend you use D-locks wherever possible.
