ACTION UNDERTAKEN IN RELATION TO YOUR PRIORITIES

You said: You were concerned about youths congregating on the grassed area in Benedict Close and causing anti-social behaviour.

We did: Police have conducted regular patrols with the Test Valley Council Community Wardens and, as and when appropriate, we have dealt with offences and advised the youths about their behaviour.

CRIME PREVENTION

We have had reports about cold callers approaching properties in this area. A cold caller is somebody who calls at your door without an invitation and research shows that there is a link between cold calling and doorstep crime, such as distraction burglary and bogus property repairs. Please be mindful that callers may not be who they say they are and always ask to see appropriate ID before letting anyone you don't know inside your home. Fortunately, these types of crime are not common. However, to assist in your protection against such crime, Hampshire Constabulary have teamed up with Trading Standards to put together initiatives and reduce cold calling in the area. A youth has been charged with various burglary offences and is currently being remanded in custody until his court appearance in July.
