ACTION UNDERTAKEN IN RELATION TO YOUR PRIORITIES

You said: You wanted us to address parking issues in Rownhams.

We did: We attended the affected areas and completed leaflet drops, advising car users about their parking in the area. We also completed house to house enquiries to listen to residents' views and/or concerns. We have also liaised with our partner agencies to assist them with dealing with parking complaints.

You said: There is a problem with fly-tipping in the Orchard, Chilworth.

We did: We are continuing to liaise with partner agencies and the landowners to resolve this issue.

JUSTICE SEEN, JUSTICE DONE

Following a report of a racial incident which occurred at Rownhams Services in November 2009, a man was arrested and charged in connection with the offence. He is due to appear in court in April.

A court case is due to take place on April 13 in relation to the series of burglaries in Chilworth that happened towards the end of last year.

In addition to this, a man has been arrested and charged with one other burglary in Chilworth.

CRIME PREVENTION

Thefts from motor vehicles

Thank you to everyone who has called in to report any suspicious behaviour in the area. We are pleased to report that we have seen a decrease in the number of thefts from motor vehicles, dwelling and non-dwelling burglaries for the first quarter of this year. We thank you for your help in achieving this and urge you to keep the calls coming.

We would like to take this opportunity to offer the following crime prevention advice regarding vehicle security and remind you to remain vigilant with vehicle, home and your personal security. Please do not leave any valuables in your vehicles and do not leave any items which could attract thieves on display, such as:

- Hand bags and wallets
- Mobile Phones
- Any luggage / bags (even if empty)
- Stereos, MP3 Players or CDs
- Loose change – We received a report where a window was smashed so that offenders could gain £2.20 in change.
- Sat Navs and cradles - if you leave the cradle attached thieves may still break in to look for the Sat Nav.
- Cigarettes
