Community Priorities

- **To provide greater visible policing in the neighbourhood** – along with increased patrols, officers aim to interact with members of their local communities through street briefings and beat surgeries.
- **To reduce anti- social behaviour and underage drinking** – the team will be concentrating their efforts on Havant Road, Lindisfarne Close and the surrounding areas.
- **Reducing burglaries within Drayton and Farlington**- Hampshire Constabulary are currently engaged in a force wide operation (Nemesis) targeting burglars within the force area. As a SNT team we are committed to support this operation through high visibility patrolling, public reassurance, information and intelligence gathering, robust targeting of offenders and meaningful engagement with the communities we serve to improve awareness of crime prevention measures.
- **The Dairy, Station Road** – There has been an increase in reports of youths gaining access to the property and causing anti social behaviour. Thefts of copper piping from the property and homeless man was moved on from the property. Demolition is due to begin on 21st March 2010. In the meantime Wardens and Police are patrolling and Wardens are trying to work with the managing agents and Landlords to secure the property

Dispersal order is now in force.</p>			<p>28/10/2009 Crime Prevention Officer (CPO) has been tasked to investigate potential environmental improvements to Lindisfarne Close. Letters have been sent to residents asking their usage of alleyways and routes in and out of the close. 30 out of 58 surveys have been completed. The view is to gate certain alleys to stop rat runs. This work has already started with CPO attending to carry out a survey and propose gating measures CPO has drawn up a plan of suggestions. Recommendations are now with Housing Association for consideration. CCTV, improved lighting and gating has been recommended.</p> <p>23/12/2009 A leaflet drop will be taking place on 03/01/10 to invite residents to a meeting at the Baptist Church on Havant Road in the new year. At this meeting current proposals will be discussed. Resident feedback re: current measures will also be requested.</p> <p>20/01/2010 Dispersal Order ends at the end of January. Figures show that ASB in Lindisfarne has halved during the time of the Dispersal Order. 140 Surveys have been given to residents with only around 30% returning them. The meeting on the 11th January only had an attendance of around 2 people from the Close. First Wessex have confirmed that the drying area is to be demolished. Railings are to be erected on a small wall in Beaumont House area. Although attendance to meetings has not been high, initial analysis of the dispersal order outcome is very encouraging.</p> <p>17/02/10 First Wessex have advised that the funding for alley gating and pulling down the drying area were approved on 16/02/10 and the work is scheduled for completion by the end of March There have been an increased number of calls regarding youths kicking footballs at houses. 'Scamnesty 2010'

Between 1st February and 26th February the Office of Fair Trading are running an event called 'Scamnesty'. During this time secure bins will be placed in public areas where people can deposit scam mail or email they have received, to be investigated by Trading Standards.

'Smartwater'

£15,000 has been given by PCC. 750 Smartwater kits will be deployed in our top 20 streets for dwelling burglaries. They will be given to the victim's premises plus 5 premises either side. This should happen in February and March.

As from 1st April, each dwelling burglary will be assessed by a Crime Prevention Officer – if it meets the criteria, Smartwater will be deployed again at victims address and 5 either side.

For both of these schemes a single point of contact at each station is required (Sgt) who will be able to deploy his/her officers.
