- 249.1 Minutes of the last meeting were agreed and the Action Chart reviewed
- 249.2 PDRs: Chief Superintendent Netherton stressed the importance of getting PDRs up to date as 3OCU is currently the worst in the Force and will be answerable to the Police Authority in the very near future. Angela Lee advised that the spreadsheet is now up to date and the MAs will be starting the new system for progressing PDRs. (217.1) **Everyone is to check to see what PDRs are over on the live PDR list on the intranet.**

- 249.6 The Powerpoint presentation and handouts for Op Shutout are now ready to be delivered to the public; however, there are insufficient laptops, projectors and screens available in the OCU for it to be freely used. It was understood that some laptops and projectors were on order, to be paid for by the rural issues under spend, prior to the last year end. Cherie Watson to check on the order and ensure 3 laptops, 3 projectors and 4 screens were purchased as soon as possible. (236.2) **Cherie Watson said that Linda Roach had ordered these and will find out the estimated arrival date.**

249.7 The PCSOs are now in place and trained. There was a short discussion where Chief Superintendent Netherton advised that the national project team have yet to provide targets for PCSOs. Chief Inspector Mellors suggested that a meeting be arranged for the Chief Inspectors and all PCSOs to meet and clarify the PCSOs' objectives, possibly in 2 to 3 months time. Action: Superintendent Chatterton to task Sgt Clarke with arranging a venue and meeting. (239.4) **This has been arranged for the 9th July by Beckie Hunt.**

249.8 Cherie Watson distributed the latest budget figures for the Rural and BCU Funds and a short discussion followed. Approximate allocations from the new year's BCU fund of £40,000 per District, £20,000 to CID and PPU, £20,000 to Neighbourhood Policing and £20,000 to Media and Communications have been made. Chief Inspector Mellors suggested that a review of spending is scheduled for September or October. This was agreed to. (242.4) **Cherie Watson said that the rural budget had been done but the BCU fund was not through yet. Budgets were discussed and this is to be reviewed in September. Chief Superintendent Netherton said that it was up to the Chief Inspector's to negotiate with their councils on what to do with their BCU fund. Chief Superintendent Netherton spoke about the control strategy.**

249.10 Building projects in various stations were discussed and agreed to continue, however, Chief Superintendent Netherton reconfirmed that the front office changes at Basingstoke will be put on hold for the time being. Due to the number of related moves and changes being considered for Aldershot Cherie Watson will ask James Collins to schedule a meeting of all concerned parties to discuss the issues. (242.4) **This will be discussed at the OCU improvement day on the 11th June.**

250. Superintendent Chatterton's Update

250.1 Superintendent Chatterton gave an update on Neighbourhood Policing. 58 of the 61 profiles have been completed and they need putting on a force template and some of the analytical work needs adding, this is being done by Debra Davis. This is hoped to be completed by the 7th July. The website is nearly finished.

250.2 Chief Superintendent Netherton spoke about beat ethos and is meeting with all sector inspectors regarding this that beat officers are about dealing with anything that goes on in their community whether it is crime, criminals or problems. This is the message that needs to get all officers.

250.3 Superintendent Chatterton gave up an update on the independent report that ACPO had received regarding Grade 3 calls and they have noted the contents but asked for a longer review to take place, this takes them up to November.

250.4 Inspector Claire Taylor is looking at neighbourhood forums and best practice. Inspector Taylor will bring a paper to the next SMT regarding what is happening around the Force.

250.5 Bikes and clothing were discussed. Cherie Watson gave an update on this. Sgt Pete Clark is working on who wants to ride a bike and then this will help with distribution. Superintendent Chatterton has said that this has become urgent now. Certain solutions were discussed.

250.6 Overtime has been completed.

251. Presentation on consultation and research for the North and East OCU

251.1 Clare Simkin and Steph Bryant came to talk about the safer neighbourhood survey and how as an organisation are we going to measure the impact of the safer neighbourhoods. This was discussed.
