Stop and Search.

Rushmoor. Chief Inspector Gillian Cox.

Rushmoor remains relatively static in our use of Stop & Search. Although the district increased the number of stops by 13%, our positive outcomes increased by 18% meaning we are finding more of what we are looking for but this could improve further. A contributory factor for this will be County Lines Intensification Week (CLIW), which was a week-long initiative with focused, coordinated action against county line offenders and safeguarding victims. As a district, we have had a real drive on tackling shoplifting, which will account for the increase in searches for stolen goods. Of these searches, we have had almost a 50% positive outcome rate.

From the stops conducted, 14.1% were intelligence led and a further 69% were self-initiated by officers using their powers to complete proactive searches. The greatest area of improvement has been in disproportionality. Last quarter, a black person was 9.9 times more likely to be stopped than a white person however this has dropped to 2.9.

Our overall positive outcome rate remains static at 46% with Stop & Search continuing to be a valuable tool in addressing drug related harm and criminality in the area. I will continue to monitor our use of Stop & Search to ensure that we use our powers effectively, lawfully and proportionately.
