The number of Stop & Searches completed has decreased slightly, but the proportion of searches which have led to arrests has increased significantly which is a positive sign, meaning that officers are still targeting the right people based on intelligence.

Drug related searches continue to account for the majority, with the second most common reason being searches for weapons – all things we will always actively look to take off our streets.

Disproportionality within the district does not raise considerable concern, but will always be subject to close scrutiny with the support of our Independent Advisory Group to ensure that we can justify each and every search.

Stop & Search continues to be a valuable tool in addressing drug related harm and criminality in the area. We remain committed to monitoring our use of Stop & Search to ensure that we use our powers effectively, lawfully and proportionately.
