Key Accountabilities	1. To assist the Police with the humane dispatch of injured animals, to be prepared to respond to call-outs day or night. 2. To work collaboratively with emergency services to ensure the safe working environment for all persons present at the scene of an incident. 3. To maintain safe working practices when in possession of Firearms and ammunition, especially en route and during a deployment. 4. To represent Hampshire and Isle of Wight Constabulary in a professional manner, providing regular and effective service Note: This role profile is designed to assist postholders with understanding what is expected of them in their role.				
Additional Requirements	To be successfully vetted through the force recruitment processes and be suitability for application to be reviewed by the Force Firearms Licensing department. Successful applicants will have their Firearms Certificate endorsed with a clear condition authorising their use for the humane dispatch of animals as required by Hampshire & Isle of Wight Constabulary. Nominated individuals fall into the category of volunteer and the Police have an extended insurance policy to cover volunteers who are assisting the Police in their duty. Third party insurance cover would therefore be extended to all nominated individuals. Public Liability third party Insurance is provided by Hampshire and Isle of Wight Constabulary whilst engaged in the humane dispatch of animals. Individuals require personal accident insurance cover provided through membership of BASC / BDS so membership of one of these organizations is essential Successful applicants must hold personal vehicle insurance with business use when engaged in Humane Animal Dispatch.				



To update availability in good time to allow call out system to be up to date and accurate, ensuring you are fit and available for call out from Police contact management, night and day.

To travel a minimum distance of 7 miles from home address to a HAD call out
